

The Internal Market - Digital and Social Challenges, HT 2023

No significant changes or major decisions on the course have been made this semester.

Strengths of the course according to the students: Several students point out that they appreciated the seminars. Some wish for more seminars rather than lectures. Many students have also appreciated the structure of the course with a written exam before Christmas and an assignment at the end of the course after the weekends. The teachers seem to have been appreciated as well.

Weaknesses of the course according to the students: Several students have pointed out that the course literature was not covered in the lectures and seminars. Some students emphasize that clearer instructions on assignment would have been desirable early in the course.

Course coordinator/equivalent and possibly other teaching staff's analysis of the course implementation and results: The autumn course has gone well.

The students' results were expected given the good mix of program students, exchange students and master students.

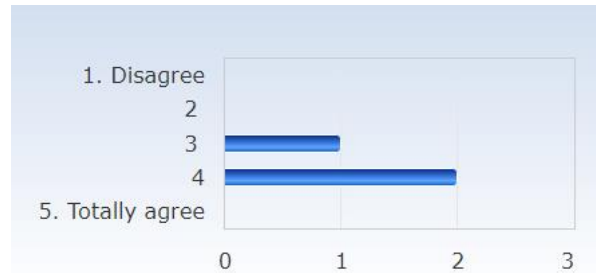

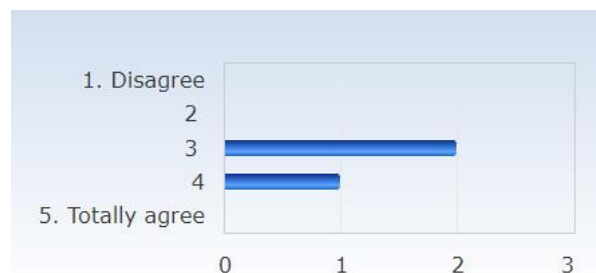

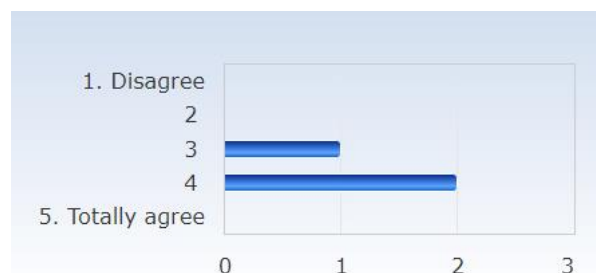

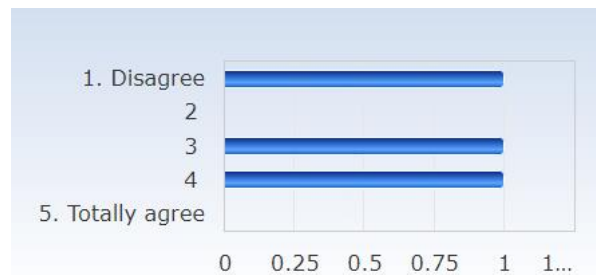
