The aim of this newsletter is to inform Bolin Centre researchers of recent-past and upcoming activities.

The Bolin Centre for Climate Research is a multi-disciplinary consortium of more than 200 researchers led by Stockholm University that conducts fundamental research on the climate system. Founded in 2006, it involves collaboration between the Departments of Meteorology, Applied Environmental Science, Physical Geography and Quaternary Geology and Geological Science at Stockholm University together with FLOW at Royal Institute of Technology (KTH) and the Rossby Centre at the Swedish Meteorological and Hydrological Institute (SMHI). It also forges connections to other Swedish research institutions and to international research organizations.

The mission is to create and communicate fundamental climate and Earth system knowledge as part of an evolving global effort to understand and adapt to the Earth's changing climate. Our research is structured into six multidisciplinary and cross departmental Research Areas (RA):

The group has a clear mandate and modus operandi that will be posted on the website. We expect them to introduce themselves in a science event on the afternoon before the Bolin Days in November 2014.
