No significant changes or major decisions have been taken on the course this semester.

Strengths of the course according to the students: Several students emphasize that they appreciated the seminars. Many students also appreciated the structure of the course with a written exam before Christmas and an assignment at the end of the course after the weekends. The teachers seem to have been appreciated as well.

Weaknesses of the course according to the students: several students have pointed out that the course literature was not touched upon in the lectures and seminars.

Analysis of the course implementation and results by the course director/assessor and possibly other teaching staff: The autumn course has gone well.

Students' results were generally better than normal, at least in the examination.

Conclusions and possible suggestions for changes and possible decisions already taken to develop the course for future course sessions: No major changes or major decisions about the course will be taken for HT23. The course literature will be reviewed. In the future, major changes may be made. However, such changes will require changes to the syllabus.





Provide more the bigger picture and connections

With the variety of topics it was sometimes difficult to identify a "red thread" in the course connecting the social and the digital part. In my view "EU Social Law" and "EU Digital Law" could each be taught as an elective course themselves. The simultaneous teaching required a lot of extra work to achieve a solid understanding of both topics. Given what was expected in the exam and the assignment however the teaching was sufficient.

I'm a bit disappointed in the digital part of the course. The only reason i chose this course was because i wanted to learn more about digital law but I found the lessons very confusing. The lessons was mostly only going through a lot of different laws and paragraphs and that was basically it. I did not understand how that would make one understand digital law in EU by only going trough the laws. There should've been more seminars on the digital law as well to better grasp the subject. And the lessons has to change and it was kind of boring. I also think the exam should have been in january instead of december as it was quite stressful, and change places with the written assignment as I rather would have turned in the assignment in december and done the exam in january.
