Resultat från kursvärderingen, svarsfrekvens, antal och procent

Bilägges, antal svarande på kursvärderingen är 11 studenter, jämfört med 37 studenter som slutfört kursen. 63,6 % har svarat att "instämmer helt" att de är nöjda med kursen, om man även räknar med "instämmer, delvis" blir siffran 90,9 %. Ingen student har svarat "instämmer inte alls" eller "instämmer inte, delvis". Studenterna är också nöjda vad gäller administration av kursen.

Det har skett mindre uppdateringar av seminarieuppgifter. Läraren Barbara Goy medverkar ej längre vilket skapade utmaning då hon var uppskattad lärare som hade fyra kursmoment. Hon ersattes av Nikola Hajdin (modes of liability/comman responsibility), Melinda Taylor (advocacy) och Meg deGuzman (ICTY, IMRCT). Johan Hirschfeldt kunde inte heller medverka som ordförande i rättegångspelet, han behövde ej ersättas av någion särskild lärare då Mark Klamberg och Mariana Faikh tidigare medverkat i samma kursmoment. I öppnade upp för att studenterna kunde ta hjälp av Chat GPT givet att de följde skriftligt angivna riktlinjer i kursbeskrivningen.


Less group work - perhaps the moot court could be a group activity, but the moot court written submissions could be individual.

Would also be good to have an exam, because at present there was nothing to test our knowledge on anything learnt in the lectures.




