Course report: Copyright and Transborder Litigation

Copyright and Transborder Litigation, 15 Credits, Autumn Semester, Academic year 2023/2024, JU699M

The purpose of the course report is to document the course evaluation, in part for the department's long-term follow-up of the education, but also to serve as support in the pedagogical development work for future courses.

Description of changes since the last course (if any) and decisions already made since last course date (if any):

Compared to the previous edition of this course, the literature list was updated in Spring 2023 to provide students with up-to-date bibliographical indications.

In addition, like every year, the content of the course was adjusted to reflect the most current and topical developments in the fields of copyright and transborder litigation, including:

- 1. The national transpositions of Directive 2019/790 and related litigation;
- 2. The adoption/finalization of new EU legislative instruments, including the Digital Services Act and the AI Act;
- 3. Recent and pending case law of the Court of Justice of the European Union.

The strengths of the course's according to the students (summary based on quantitative results, text responses from the survey and any other evaluation during the course)

Six students (out of nineteen enrolled in the course) submitted an evaluation of the course (attached).

Based on the students' responses, strengths of the course include:

- 1. Communication of learning outcomes (100% respondents "strongly agreed" that they were clearly communicated);
- 2. Close correlation between learning outcomes and learning activities (83,3% "strongly agreed" that such a close correlation did exist) and between learning outcomes and the examination (100% "strongly agreed" that such a close correlation did exist);
- 3. Clear, logical and orderly structure of the course (83,3% "strongly agreed" that this was the case);
- 4. Contribution of learning activities to the achievement of learning outcomes (100% respondents "strongly agreed"), and room for discussion of relevant issues within learning activities (100% respondents "strongly agreed");
- 5. Good administration of the course (83,3% respondents "strongly agreed");
- 6. High quality of the feedback provided (83,3% respondents "strongly agreed");

Furthermore, respondents highlighted the following as their preferred aspects of the course sub Question 13:

- 1. Moot Court;
- 2. Structure of the course;
- 3. Professor Rosati's engagement and passion for the subject.

The weaknesses of the course according to the students (summary based on quantitative results, text responses from the survey and any other evaluation during the course.

The following were flagged as weaknesses sub Question 14:

- 1. Classes on private international law (transborder litigation);
- 2. Guest (external) lecturers, delivered by external professionals;
- 3. Timing of assignments.

The teachers' analysis of the course's implementation and results; Conclusions and suggestions for possible changes in order to develop the course and any decisions already made to develop the course before future course dates.

Overall, while the number of responses received (six) was limited compared to the overall number of students (nineteen) enrolled in the course, the feedback was very positive. This indicates that the structure, content, and delivery of the course should be broadly maintained as is.

In terms of proposed changes for the next edition of the course, the part of the course devoted to transborder litigation and the role of external lectures will be re-considered and strengthened.










