

Zoom does not allow a good discussion and it is much harder to actually stay concentrated. However, it allows a certain flexibility.


The lectures got cancelled most of the time, 10 minutes before they would start.

We have the time to pause the videos and write down what is said. It is also more flexible and helps us organize our lives better.





A bit, the book was quite expansive and the chapters were quite long and not all of it was necessary to read. sure.



I really like the way Jarna does her lectures but it was a shame that so many of them were canceled last minute.



Better communication with the lecturer and organising of the schedule (not cancelling the lessons 20min before the actual lesson)

First, better organization of the course. I understand that we live in time of pandemic, but that is not an excuse for such a bad organization of the course. SU should find a replacement or other solution for situation like this (it's not the first month of the pandemic, so you should have known better).

Half of the lectures were not conducted properly. If I wanted to listen a video-recorded lectures I could have watched YouTube videos, not going to Stockholm University. I'm so disappointed.

Second, notifications about changes in schedule and postponing lectures were given last minute. Really inappropriate and unprofessional.

Third, lectures (at least the ones that we have) were mostly focused on Europe (biased), maybe that can be improved.

Finally, Human Rights is a great subject where critical analysis and debates can be encouraged. We didn't have enough space and time for that.

The teaching. The lectures were interesting, but went a bit fast sometimes. What stood out for me the most was that the lectures got cancelled so many times, even 5 - 10 minutes before the lecture had to take place. In my opinion that is really unprofessional and in this way you do not motivate your students to really study.

I belive that we (this group, HT21) were unlucky referring to all the shedule changes and lost lectures due to Jarna beeing sick. It was also sad rarely being on site. I wouldve wished for more seminars, it would help me in my learning process. It would have made us read more relevant case law not only treating the right or rights we chose to write about in the case study and essay and also enhanced discussion of the rights.

Information regarding canceled classes and materials for the same must be better communicated.


We missed various classed because of the teacher's health situation, I would have wanted to get these recorded then or even now, afterwards.


