Results from the course evaluation, response frequency, number and percentage

Attached, the number of respondents to the course evaluation is 6 students, compared to 40 students who completed the course. 33.3% have answered that they "completely agree" that they are satisfied with the course, if you also count "agree, partially" the figure is 66.6%. 1 student has answered "do not agree at all" or "do not agree, partially". The students appreciated the administration of the course.

As a subject representative and course director at departmental meetings, I have previously suggested how the response rate can be increased: course evaluation is given to the students in connection with the teaching opportunity at the beginning of the next course according to the model of engineering education at LTH (Lund).

Description of any changes and any decisions made since the last course session

A novelty was that for each lecture the students got a tutorial with texts to read and questions to prepare for each lecture making them more into seminars. This was done in order to counter criticism from students previous semesters that the course was to basic. No other substantial changes compared to the previous term.



Though my mistake for not reading through them before the exam, we were not able to discuss the issues and cases thoroughly as no one was prepared. So my only suggestion with this would be to please be sure that all materials are posted before the class, though this was just one miss and is understandable.

I would have liked it if more students participated during the class.. I don't know how to encourage this as some are perhaps nervous speaking in English and shy but getting the discussion going a bit more by somehow encouraging more participation would be beneficial in my opinion. Not sure if lack of participation was due to not preparing or shyness...
