Course report: course International Criminal Law, 15 credits (HP), Spring 2024

Results from the course evaluation, response frequency, number and percentage

Attached, the number of respondents to the course evaluation is 8 students, compared to 39 students who completed the course. 12.5% have answered that they "completely agree" that they are satisfied with the course, if you also count "agree, partially" the figure is 38.5%. 2 students have answered "do not agree at all" or "do not agree, partially". There is some discontent with the administration of the course. The discontent appears to concern lack of information on how to do the tasks.

As a subject representative and course director at departmental meetings, I have previously suggested how the response rate can be increased: course evaluation is given to the students in connection with the teaching opportunity at the beginning of the next course according to the model of engineering education at LTH (Lund).

Description of any changes and any decisions made since the last course session

The syllabus was changed compared to Spring 2023 with the introduction of a classroom exam. Simultaneously, on order to reduce the burden on the students and keep the examination points at the same level, the requirement for a mini-PM before seminars was abolished with associated points for these seminars.



#### What was good with the course

The moot court was fantastic, plus the various guest speakers. Also, thought-provoking questions in the seminars. Interesting subject

#### 6. What changes do you suggest for the course

#### What changes do you suggest for the course

Would have been nicer to go deeper into some cases (ICTY/ICC). Maybe encourage even more critical thinking, talking about controversies in ICL. The moot court should perhaps have more points, given that it was quite time-consuming. To make the level of the lectures more adequate to the exam: topics were made too easy during the lectures, then the exam was escessively long and detailed compared to what was said during the course. Also, more preparation and discussion about the moot court (especially if the feedback after criticizes things that were never said to be required). Less lectures on history and more on tough topics like mens rea, responsibility and procedure.

There should be a sufficient instruction on the subject. It was very hard to follow in the beginning because in my opinion, there was no clear introduction what international criminal law is exactly and what we have to do and what we have to expect during this course. The different lectures were in the wrong order for me. This would have made it much more clearer if there would have been a clear structure.

Better information flow, and clearer instructions when it comes to especially the moot court and the motion. I felt like there were no clear instructions, and most instructions and relevant information was just copied from previous years (and for example contained the wrong dates and times). In addition, I think the course had a feel of being in some way "half way" because Mark could not attend. I think there should have been made bigger efforts to make a more tidy course instead of half way solutions.

I would suggest giving more importance to the written exam than to the essay for evaluative purposes. This is because very little space is dedicated during the course to the preparation of the essay (only one seminar ad very early during the course) , whilst the exam can be prepared individually using the book and attending lectures.

I would schedule the theoretical seminar at a later point at the course. I don't think that it is very realistic that students start earnestly thinking about or even writing the essay after the first two weeks of the course.




### 16. The course has increased the students' understanding of the significant of legal thought in a changing world:




