The textbook was so long. Some chapters were really useful, but there were some chapters with a lot of history and description which I don't find it very useful in practice.


It would be good if e-copies of the course literature could be made available as the books are very expensive. Also, E-copies are easier to access and search from during the exam. I really wish they could be available.


In addition to the lectures, the case study the essay, the seminar sessions, and the problem-based seminar there was not enough time to go through the whole book.

#### Comment

It made it more accessible and gave more time for reading and learning.

There was limited time and space for discussion. Although questions were encouraged by the Professor, it was not possible to spent much time on discussing relevant issues in international law. Thus, the discussions were always short (question-answer) with no opportunity to have real legal discussion between students.

I think the online classes hindered the interaction of the class. Most of the time it was a monologue and that lost some of the interest of the cpurse.

Having online lectures reduced the participation in the class. I participated several times but I was not as motivated as I would have if the courses were on campus

- Online lectures lead to fewer discussions
- less exchange between students
- It is a pity that due to the online lectures the students had hardly any opportunity to get to know other fellow students. However, this would be desirable especially for international students
- The idea to book a room for all students was unfortunately rejected or referred to book rooms in the library on our own Online teaching could be useful for other people who cannot displace or have other responsibilities, indeed, they should be provided with the means for following the class; but for my personal situation online classes do not work as much as classes on campus, so the probabilities of immersing in the topic drop, as even after a year and a half before the start of the pandemic they still seem a bit unreal to me, not linking students and professors enough



#### Comment

The obligatory seminar (moot court) was really improvised. We got the case so late and it was stressful to organize and work on argumentation with 10 people in the group only in a few hours. Also, there were not good instructions of what is expected (i.e. if everyone needs to have oral presentation, or because it is a group work, one can present all etc.). In addition - zoom is not the best option for this kind of seminars.

The home exam was so long. I understand that legal professions require 'work under pressure', but it is almost impossible to answer good! all the questions in that time, even if you have learn before.

And lastly, the results of the examination of the written assignments can come a little faster :)

Communications about stuff and what is expected of us need to be more clear I feel. Also, we need more guidance and support with career opportunities and possible internships during/after our course.

What definitely needs to be improve are the instructions of the course. Instructions on the essay, such as providing a sample study. Also better instructions about the course as a whole. We were unsure if we could do the exam again, and or the assignments. More communication about the structure of the course was definitely needed. Most of us felt lost during the course about some of this topics.

Communication to students can be improved. Often promises were not kept. This could have been prevented by better communication.


More detailed instructions on written assignments, the problem-based seminar, and the exam would also be desirable. I missed the lesson of the Law of the Sea

We did not know in advance what to expect in terms of the output (case study and essay), and it would have been nice if instructions were uploaded earlier than it was. The professor's feedback for the case study was well written, but I wish we received it earlier so we could have kept such constructive criticisms in mind when preparing for the essay. It was unfortunate that Prof. Petman encountered technical difficulties due to her mac/computer's demise, and I guess that contributed to the delay? We did not (and still do not) know what to expect in terms of time frame as to when we will get our results/rating for the requirement (and the course in general, too) so some people feel stressed out about that.

In terms of content, I have no comment, except that I do believe we were still supposed to have one more lecture after the problem-based seminar about the law of the sea, but we did not end up discussing that. It was also removed from the schedule afterwards (or did I just miss that?) I read the chapter in the book, but would have wanted to listen to a lecture about it
