Course rapport: Advance Course in Public International Law, 15 university credits, Autumn 2023

There were significant disturbances during this course which regretfully had a negative impact for the students. When the course was designed and started the previous course director essentially had all teaching activities. The previous course director cancelled, postponed and converted live lectures into recorded lectures. When doing so the previous course director used communication channels with the students (messaging) without sharing or notifying the course administrator of these changes. The changes also caused significant reactions from the students who contacted the course administrator. When three weeks of the course remained the previous course director and the head of the law department agreed that the course director should resign from her employment at the law department. This would take effect immediately when it came to her teaching obligations. At the same time the previous course director removed all teaching materials from the course website, material necessary for the students being able to take the exam. I had to take over as course director during these circumstances. I have full understanding for the criticism that the students have voiced in the course evaluations and in other contexts. In lack of a teacher for the next year, we decided to pause the course for Autumn 2024 and resume the course when a new teacher has been recruited, all in order to have a course with high quality.

Results from the course evaluation, response frequency, number and percentage

Attached, the number of respondents to the course evaluation is 11 students, compared to 38 students who completed the course. 9.1% have answered that they "completely agree" that they are satisfied with the course. 7 students answered "do not agree at all" or "do not agree, partially". The students had major criticism concerning the administration of the course. Thus, the students were very dissatisfied with the course.

As a subject representative and course director at departmental meetings, I have previously suggested how the response rate can be increased: course evaluation is given to the students in connection with the teaching opportunity at the beginning of the next course according to the model of engineering education at LTH (Lund).

Course director

Course director Y for the main part, the course was completed with Mark Klamberg as course director. I am keeping the name of the previous course director anonymous since this report will become public and might be perceived as critical of course director Y and myself. In the part the report is critical of me I am fine with having my name public.

Description of any changes and any decisions made since the last course session No major changes when it came to the substance of the course.

The strengths of the course according to the students (summary based on quantitative results, free text answers and any other evaluation during the course)

Several students expressed great appreciation for course director Y as a teacher.

Weaknesses of the course according to the students (summary based on quantitative results, free text answers and any other evaluation during the course)

Several students remarked on the sudden change of course director mid-term and the lack of consistency that the change created.

Course director and possibly other teaching teachers' analysis of the course implementation and results

The students that answered the survey do not mention that several lectures were cancelled and/or postponed lectures or that lectures converted from having a live teacher in class to recorded video-lectures during the first half of the course. Yet, the change of course director and related problems had a greater impact. I find the students' reaction as recorded in the course survey logical. I think the sudden change of the course director in itself caused great confusion which attracted legitimate criticism from the students. It was a problem that I as a course director could not be present in class, instead we had to find replacements among several teachers who had little time to prepare.

I find the criticism from the students entirely relevant and valid, the law department as an institution has to assure better quality and administration of its courses.

Conclusions as well as possible proposals for changes and any decisions already made to develop the course for future course events

In lack of teacher for the next year, we decided to pause the course for Autumn 2024 and resume the course when a new teacher has been recruited. When the course is resumed we will replace the take home exam with examination in class. The feedback from master students from the Autumn 2022 semester was that the course was to basic which we consider to be relevant criticism. It is somewhat uncertain to what extent this concern was implemented in planning of the course for Autumn 2023. When the course is restarted my recommendation is that we need to make the learning-teaching activities more challenging.
