Wednesday, October 16 Focus on Social Justice

Stockholm University (SU)

We meet at 9.00 at "Pärlan", **Albanovägen 18**, House 1, Floor 6, close to Stockholm Business School, SU.

During this day, we will explore the role of social justice in transforming enterprise education. We will gain insights into the ambition of creating a socially inclusive society and how this goal can be central to collaboration. In the morning session, we will explore how social entrepreneurs, academic teachers, and students have been engaged in a joint venture to generate ideas, improve practices, and reflect on their experiences. In the afternoon, we will participate in one of the TrEE interventions developed in the project, which includes a walk to the Stockholm School of Entrepreneurship (SSES). There, we will deepen our understanding of how collaboration among five universities is advancing entrepreneurship education in higher education.

Thursday, October 17 Focus on Pedagogies of Hope



Stockholm University (SU)

We meet at 9.00 at "Pärlan", **Albanovägen 18**, House 1, Floor 6, close to Stockholm Business School, SU.

Throughout the day, we will focus on how to create hope in our pedagogical approaches and activities. We propose that the purpose of hope in transforming enterprise education is not to dismiss the challenges of transformation or to shy away from difficult topics like social and ecological crises. Instead, hope empowers us to confront these issues, to boldly bring them into the classroom, and to take meaningful action. We will explore various dimensions of integrating hope into pedagogy and discuss how TrEE, as a radical pedagogy of hope, can be expanded to other contexts.

9.00 - 9.30 TrEE exhibition and morning coffee

9.30 - 12.00 Exploring pedagogies of hope

In this session, we will take part of three examples of pedagogies of hope. We will learn how music can be integrated in our pedagogies to practice collective dimensions (with Michal Zawadzki from Uppsala University), how pedagogy can work as a beacon of light in the darkest of times (with Erik Melin, Hanna Astner and Josefina Jonsson from the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences) and the matter of place and the design of learning environments for student active learning (with Magnus Hansson from Örebro University). The presentations will be followed by questions, and discussions with the audience.

12.00 - 13.00 Lunch (provided for all participants)

13.00 - 14.00 Spreading TrEE to other educational contexts

In this presentation, PhD student Annalena Glader will present her ethnographic study of a particular program in upper secondary school and its focus on entrepreneurship, highlighting both pitfalls and hopeful insights for how TrEE could push a transformation.

14.00 - 15.00 Panel discussion and questions

The presentation will be followed by reflections and questions from the experts on Swedish schools and entrepreneurship education in both the Swedish and Scandinavian context.

Wrap up on how TrEE could be integrated in other educational contexts - how can we move on?
