

Guidelines for Estimating Credits (hp) for Compilation Thesis Work

These guidelines apply to doctoral students at the Department of Psychology, Stockholm University, who were admitted after January 1, 2016.

The thesis work comprises 165 hp in total, which includes both work with the summarizing chapter (*swe. kappa*) and the sub-studies (*swe. delstudier*):

Summarizing chapter, 30 hp. Count credits based on the supervisor's assessment of progress. For example, 15 hp when approximately half of the work on the kappa is completed.

Sub-studies, minimum total 135 hp. The table below provides guidelines for assigning credits to each sub-study.

Comment:

- (a) If the study is preregistered, add one point to *1. Planning* and deduct one point from *3. Analyses*.
- (b) If the study is submitted as a Registered Report, count this as the sum of *1. Planning*, *4. Preliminary manuscript*, and *5. Submitted*.
